Castle Loch Infrastructure Upgrade - 2021

In October 2020 Paths for All visited Castle Loch to undertake an infrastructure accessibility audit. The visit covered 4595m of path, bridges and boardwalk and the following notes extract the key points raised from their 63-page report. This audit start point is 'what would be the ideal if starting from scratch', the auditor then advises the recipient to assess the report recommendations based on what is financially and practically achievable within the various constraints.

At the end of the document I've included the full costings they provided, followed by the revised costings on the priority areas to undertake, based on the CLLCT Board meeting of 22/6/21 and subject to fundraising.

1. Lochfield Cottage to Innerfield Burn

Overview

Path of compacted type 1 sub-base, 1.4m wide but vegetation is encroaching to 60cm width in places

Actions

- Carefully scrape vegetation back along path edges, cut back overhanging vegetation to 3.5m height and 1m either side of path.
- Dig in drainage letts along path where water pools min width 20cm
- Build up subbase at either end of bridge so level

2. Innerfield Burn to Kirkhirst Wood

Overview

Short section of path of compacted type 1 sub-base, 1.4m wide but vegetation is encroaching to 60cm width in places, giving way to shared farm track with deep ruts and uneven central section

Actions

- New section of path linking Innerfield Burn to Kirkhirst Wood
- Infill wheel ruts on track

3. Grassland Path to Valison Burn

Overview

Path of compacted type 1 sub-base, 1.4m wide but vegetation is encroaching to 0.3-0.4m width, sub-base stone is thin in places and path undulates, pooling water

Actions

- o carefully scrape vegetation back along path edges,
- Build up surface stone thickness
- o Build up surface stone in areas that pool water

4. Valison Burn to the Castle

Overview

Timber ramp and boardwalk giving way to a path of compacted type 1 sub-base, 1.4m wide but vegetation is encroaching to 60cm width in places. Ramp becomes flooded after heavy rains, timbers of ramp, bridge and boardwalk nearing end of life – rotting in places and undulating due to tree roots. Steep climb up to castle approach track (12% gradient)

Actions

- Replace board walk, Valison burn bridge and ramp
 - Min. 1600mm wide boardwalk, passing places no more than 50m apart, raise height in places that are the initial flooding point – see specification in audit report
 - o ramp needs to extend 15m further on from present position.
- Carefully scrape vegetation back along path edges

5. Castle track - Castle Main wood - small grassland area

Overview

Castle access track of compacted aggregate giving way to tarmac then path of compacted type 1 sub-base generally 0.6cm - 1m wide and short stretch of boardwalk

Actions

- Repairs to fence and kissing gate next to cattle grid
- carefully scrape vegetation back along path edges through wood/grassland
- Dig in drainage letts along path where water pools min width 20cm through wood/grassland
- Build up surface stone thickness where terram matting exposed
- Humped board walk needs aggregate building up at each end.

6. Sculpture trail woodland path

Overview

Path of compacted aggregate (smaller stone than other paths). Drainage culverts very old and largely completely/partially silted up

Actions

- Explore if culvert pipes can be cleared of debris
- Carefully scrape vegetation back along path edges
- Instate hard base area around picnic bench and link to path
- Improve surface of laybys (council or CL?)
- Install/improve link paths from layby to paths x 4
- Improve link between layby and accessible path leading to the accessible platform
- Valison burn bridge and bridge near accessible platform needs aggregate building up at each end. Ideally replace bridges with width of 1.5m
- Accessible platform needs repairing and resurfacing
- Remove kerbing and install link path to picnic bench on accessible platform
- Replace picnic bench on accessible platform to accessible bench

 Tidy up entrance from access road to car park near bowls club – remove/replace old fencing, possibly install entrance arch – 'Welcome to Castle Loch'

7. Victory Park to Beauly Cottage

Overview

Sits outside CL nature reserve boundary. Mix of aggregate path, open amenity grass, rough path and formal Highways' pavement.

Actions

• Little in the way of formal works by CL. Encourage community to explore a path across Victory Park to Sailing club

8. Beauly house to Lochfield Cottage

Overview

Re-enter nature reserve boundary on path of compacted aggregate through to loch side car park. Rough, unmarked path across grass to join 50m tarmac section to Lochfield Cottage

Actions

- Carefully scrape vegetation back along path edges
- Remove tree stump encroaching in to path
- Lower kerb where path joins loch side car park

General actions

Shallow coating of 20mm scalpings to depth of 50mm Cover with whindust of 25mm depth on all paths to improve accessibility

DF Comments:

- Improvements to layby surface and link paths to the main circular loch path would be good thing to do laybys are DGC Highways responsibility.
- The approach to the 3 timber bridges detailed here is unnecessary as the metal bridge frame across Valison Burn is architecturally sound and just needs replacement timbers, the other 2 bridges near Vendace Burn could do with replacing.
- The link path across the amenity grass area is Victory Park and outside our boundary we have suggested to LCC about a link path as part of their play park improvements.
- The humped timber walk way is along B7020 as exit wood on to Castle Main field It will be difficult to change this as it is designed this way to overcome a large tree route, as well as being a boggy area

Next steps:
